MISSION STATEMENT

To encourage the promotion, practise and playing of the sport of cricket in Neyland and the outlying areas.

Aims

Harness and develop all young cricketers so they have the opportunity to contribute to the game of cricket at all levels and play a central role in club cricket life

Deliver a structured and well designed coaching programme co-ordinated by qualified coaches Work with the county club to ensure fixtures for juniors are regular and competitive throughout the season. Nominate a minimum of 3 young players of adequate standard from each age group to attend county trials each year.

Develop and strengthen a structure and pathway for women and girls to actively participate in and follow cricket

Appoint a co-ordinator to focus solely on the development of the ladies cricket section. Actively encourage women playing members to join, and regularly attend meetings of, the club management committee. Work with the local schools, providing both facilities and coaches with the aim of sparking grater interest in the women's game. Aim to have at least one female coach who will, as a minimum, attend the first 3 under 9's and under 11's training sessions. Aim to have at least 3 regular female attendees at under 9's and under 11's training.

Develop and strengthen the whole club environment, promoting cricketing opportunities for disabled people Ensure that club facilities continue to be accessible to disabled groups.

Develop and promote cricket for black and ethnic minorities

Work with local schools and other organisations to ensure black and ethnic minorities are encouraged to take part in cricket

Ensure that our cricket club is an integral part of the local community, contributing an invaluable service to all sections of the local community, developing club members, supporters and volunteers

Continue to work with locals schools in an effort to get more children involved in cricket at the club. Continue to encourage local non-cricket groups to use the club and its facilities. Hold an annual open day where members of the community are invited to see the facilities, watch coaching demonstrations, bat against the club bowling machine etc. all at no cost.

Develop and strengthen senior playing teams, providing positive role models to all club members, leading achievement and success

Mens 1st XI must target a top four finish in the PCC 1st Division and the mens 2nd XI must target re-instatement to the PCC 3rd Division. Mens 1st XI to compete annually in the Welsh Cup. Womens XI to retain the PCC League Title and if possible win both the county cup competition and compete in the new Welsh cup competition assuming it runs for a second year.

How will we get there?

Increased numbers in the older age groups will be achieved by retaining the levels of participation we see in the younger age-groups. Keeping children involved and interested as they grow older is key. With regards increased participation in the younger age-groups : advertising the clubs junior coaching programme during school coaching

sessions should achieve these desired increases. Increases in coach numbers will be achieve through the training or yet more coaches. Another £1000 has been

When will we get there?

Increased participation should be seen right from the first junior session in 2009. Failing that, number are expected to increase as schools coaching becomes more regular in the months of June and July. The training of new club coaches will be complete by May 2009, well in advance of the start of junior training.

Who is responsible and partners we will be working with?

The responsibility for achieving the planned participation increases is a joint responsibility. The Junior Co-ordinator, Development Manager, and all in schools and junior coaches have a role to play in achieving the level of increases planned. The Club Development Manager is responsible for Coach education.

What will it cost (including in kind costs)?

The cost of increased participation is only related to the cost of delivering the in schools coaching programme (see, schools coaching, cost section) Administration cost and equipment provision costs are also likely to increase, however these increases will be negligible. Coach education, it is estimated, will cost the club between £1000 and £2000 in 2008/09

Who are you approaching to fund such costs?

Our regular sponsors already contribute to the cost of our schools coaching programme. All sponsors and previously approached local companies will be approached again in 2008/09. Coach education : The Community Chest fund will again be approached to help.

The increased numbers will be achieved primarily through players from the junior section becoming available to play in senior cricket. How will we get there?

In the 2008/09 off season we will again be investing heavily in coach education. We will by 20009 have a UKCC level 3 coach at the club as well as several more qualified coaches. A schools coaching committee will be formed to oversee the coaching in schools 2008/09.

When will we get there?

The training of coaches will be completed by February 2009. The formation of the schools coaching committee will be completed by January 2009. Schools coaching it is hoped will begin with a few sessions April/May 2009 however June and July will see the bulk of the session delivered, culminating in a tournament to be held at the Athletic Ground late July.

Who is responsible and partners we will be working with?

The club Development Manager is responsible for the project however it is hoped the club will be working closely with the cricket foundation (through the chance to shine scheme) and regardless will be working closely both with the Pembrokeshire coaches association and with the Local Government sports development and cricket development officers.

What will it cost (including in kind costs)?

The coaching programme we run will depend upon the level of funding we receive. If our most ambitions plans are realised it is likely to cost in the excess of £4000 to supply mainly the coach hours but also the equipment for such a scheme. If we do not receive chance to shine funding however then the club will continue with its provision of limited hours of coaching time for the schools nearest the club. 10 hours in 2008 likely becoming something in the region of 20 hours 2009. Cost - £600

How will we get there?

In the 2008/09 off season we will again be investing heavily in coach education. We will by 20009 have a UKCC level 3 coach at the club as well as several more qualified coaches. A schools coaching committee will be formed to oversee the coaching in schools 2008/09.

When will we get there?

The training of coaches will be completed by February 2009. The formation of the schools coaching committee will be completed by January 2009. Schools coaching it is hoped will begin with a few sessions April/May 2009 however June and July will see the bulk of the session delivered, culminating in a tournament to be held at the Athletic Ground late July.

Who is responsible and partners we will be working with?

The club Development Manager is responsible for the project however it is hoped the club will be working closely with the cricket foundation (through the chance to shine scheme) and regardless will be working closely both with the Pembrokeshire coaches association and with the Local Government sports development and cricket development officers.

What will it cost (including in kind costs)?

The coaching programme we run will depend upon the level of funding we receive. If our most ambitions plans are realised it is likely to cost in the excess of £4000 to supply mainly the coach hours but also the equipment for such a scheme. If we do not receive chance to shine funding however then the club will continue with its provision of limited hours of coaching time for the schools nearest the club. 10 hours in 2008 likely becoming something in the region of 20 hours 2009. Cost - £600

Who are you approaching to fund such costs?

The cricket foundation, through the chance to shine scheme. Local town councils. The Pembroke county cricket club The Pembrokeshire coaches association. Local companies for sponsorship of the scheme.
